## A Word from Father Jerry

Dear Parishioners,

Happy Halloween! I hope all have a wonderful and safe celebration this weekend.

We continue our preparation of for the implementation of the new Roman Missal. The new Missal arrived this week and is substantially larger than the missal we have been using at Mass. It is the result of years of research and the product of some of the most respected scholars in the field of translation.

What will the new Missal mean to us as a parish? There will be several new responses in the liturgy that we will have to learn. The music ministers and all of us will need to learn new musical settings that reflect the changes in the liturgy. For instance after the First Sunday of Advent we will no longer use the same, Gloria, Creed or Holy Holy that we have been using at the 9:45. Mr. Parker is working to change these settings so that we will be able to sing the appropriate prayers by the First Sunday of Advent. As you know we are only weeks away and we will begin practicing the spoken and sung changes soon.

Implementing the new Missal will give all of us an opportunity to take a fresh look at the power of the liturgy in our lives. This will be a time of renewing our faith as we join the rest of the English speaking world in embracing the new Missal. I am grateful to all those who have helped in preparing us for this transition. We will all need to be patient as the prayer of the Church goes through this period of change.

We still need adults to help us with the children's Liturgy of the Word. Please see Jim Bruton or Virginia Clayton if you would be able to help us out once a month with this important ministry.

I was so appreciative of Tom Justic's fine presentation last weekend of our annual fiscal report. As I shared last week, we have a number of challenges that we must face in this current fiscal year. Any increase you are able to make would be greatly appreciated. Last week Tom reported that 60% of our income comes through some form of fund raising and that number is long term unsustainable. The more we can increase our income from the parish, the less vulnerable we are to financial crises because of the loss of a significant source of outside money. The fact is there are increasing pressures on everyone and there can be abrupt changes that would impact us severely. If one of our sharing parishes was paired with someone else or there was a decline in weddings, we would be in trouble.

It was great to see the turnout at last week's meeting to set up the Commission structure. The new Parish Pastoral Council will require new ways of integrating the

### Reading 1

*Mal 1:14b-2:2b, 8-10*

A great King am I, says the LORD of hosts, and my name will be feared among the nations. And now, O priests, this commandment is for you: If you do not listen, if you do not lay it to heart, to give glory to my name, says the LORD of hosts, I will send a curse upon you and of your blessing I will make a curse. You have turned aside from the way, and have caused many to falter by your instruction; you have made void the covenant of Levi, says the LORD of hosts. I, therefore, have made you contemptible and base before all the people, since you do not keep my ways, but show partiality in your decisions. Have we not all the one father? *Mt 23:1-12*

Jesus spoke to the crowds and to his disciples, saying, "The scribes and the Pharisees have taken their seat on the chair of Moses. Therefore, do and observe all things whatsoever they tell you, but do not follow their example. For they preach but they do not practice. They tie up heavy burdens hard to carry and lay them on people's shoulders, but they will not lift a finger to move them. All their works are performed to be seen. They widen their phylacteries and lengthen their tassels. They love places of honor at banquets, seats of honor in synagogues, greetings in marketplaces, and the salutation 'Rabbi.' As for you, do not be called 'Rabbi.' You have but one teacher, and you are all brothers. Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven. Do not be called 'Master'; you have but one master, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted."

A very small parish operates fine with that approach but as we saw last week, Holy Family is growing and if we are a parish "whose doors are open wide", we must have inclusive structures that genuinely invites new comers and long term parishioners alike to share in the pastoral life in the parish. There must be the communication structures that allow for interaction. The Council will help all of us to prioritize our resources to be most effective. Some activates that served a purpose years ago may not today. The language of the new structures like the new language in the liturgy will take time to learn but these kinds of changes are a sign of new life.
