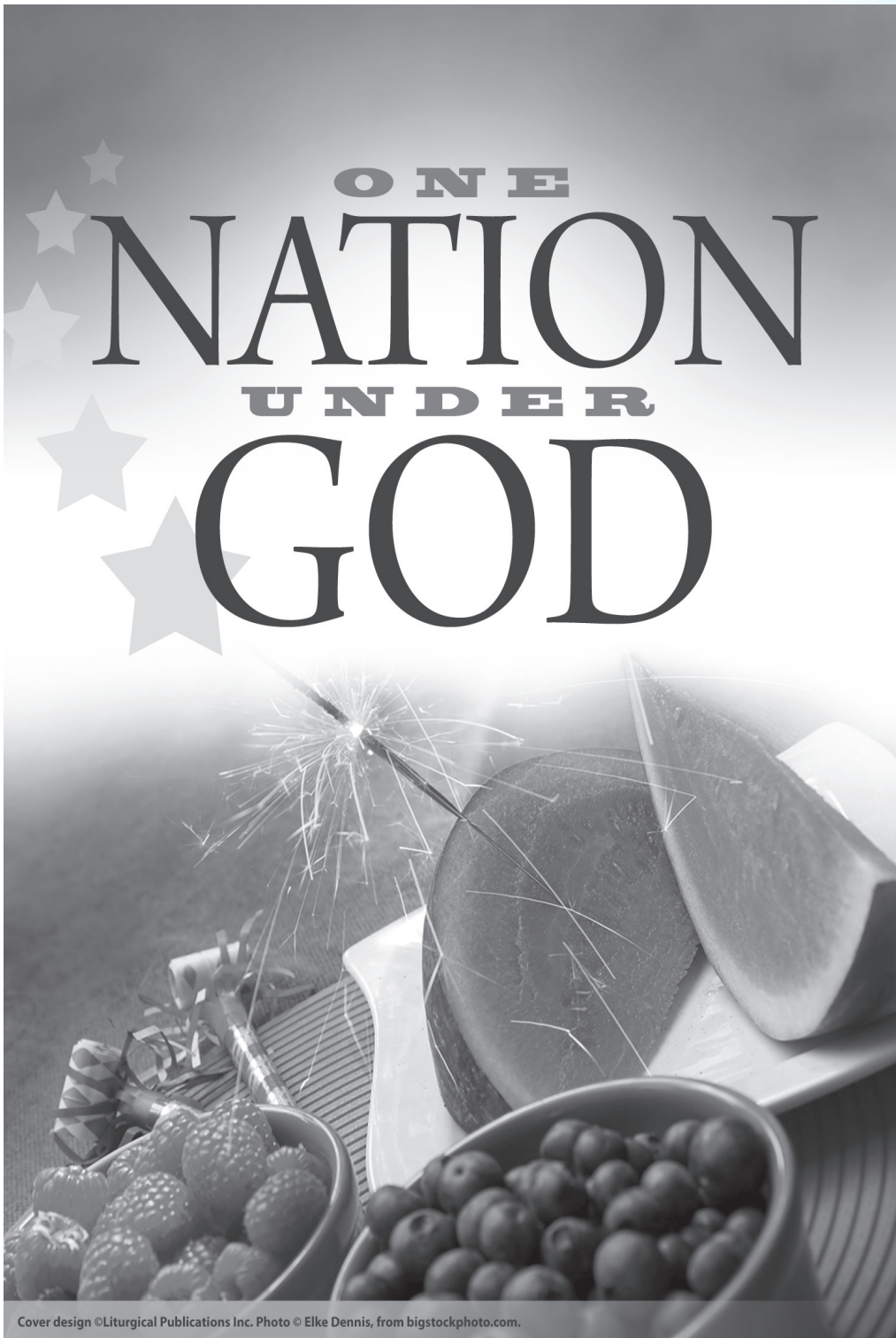

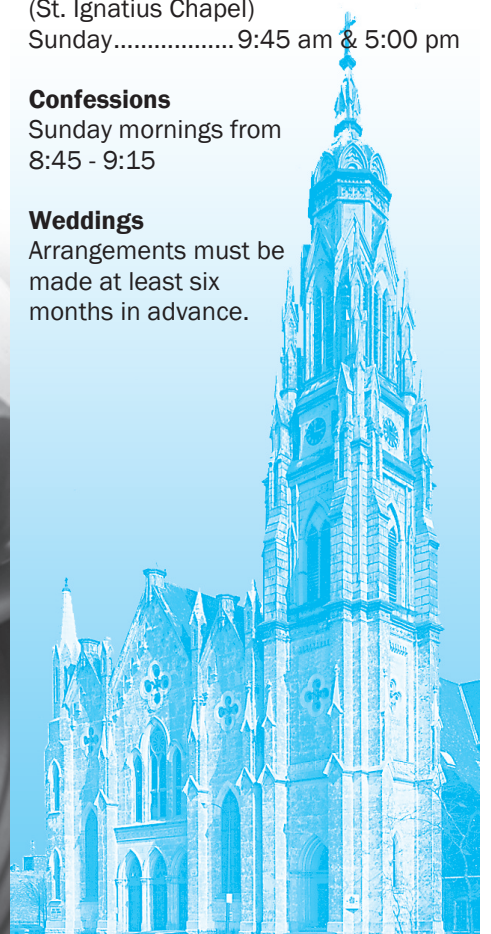

Reading 1

Is 66:10-14c

Thus says the LORD: Rejoice with Jerusalem and be glad because of her, all you who love her; exult, exult with her, all you who were mourning over her! Oh, that you may suck fully of the milk of her comfort, that you may nurse with delight at her abundant breasts! For thus says the LORD: Lo, I will spread prosperity over Jerusalem like a river, and the wealth of the nations like an overflowing torrent. As nurslings, you shall be carried in her arms, and fondled in her lap; as a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you; in Jerusalem you shall find your comfort. When you see this, your heart shall rejoice and your bodies flourish like the grass; the LORD's power shall be known to his servants.

The Word of the Lord

Gospel

Lk 10:1-12, 17-20

At that time the Lord appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. He said to them, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way. Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.' If a peaceful person lives there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you. Stay in the same house and eat and drink what is offered to you, for the laborer deserves his payment. Do not move about from one house to another. Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.' Whatever town you enter and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, 'The dust of your town that clings to our feet, even that we shake off against you.' Yet know this: the kingdom of God is at hand. I tell you, it will be more tolerable for Sodom on that day than for that town."

The seventy-two returned rejoicing, and said, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us because of your name." Jesus said, "I have observed Satan fall like lightning from the sky. Behold, I have given you the power to 'tread upon serpents' and scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy and nothing will harm you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven."

Women in Church and Society

This past year we held Bible Study
Sessions, mostly on Tuesday mornings,
on The Parables of the Kingdom. The
group was small, but we met regularly
from October until shortly before
Easter. As we studied each parable, we
pulled them apart, examined their
meaning and the underlying message
of Jesus not only for the people of his
day but also the meaning and
application it has for us in our day and
age.

During our last meetings we talked
about a number of topics we would like
to pursue in up-coming sessions. Our
first decision was to study Women in
the Bible, but later we expanded it to
include Women in Church and Society.
It is interesting to note that most women
in Scripture - be it the Old or New
Testament were not referred to by
name. We know them as someone's
wife or daughter (Pilate's wife,
Potephar's wife, Jarius' daughter) and
still others were known by the place
from which they came (Syrophonician
woman, Queen of Sheba, woman at the
well) Strange as it may seem, in looking
at Jesus' ancestry, almost half of the
women are unnamed.

To arouse your curiosity and to
encourage you to learn more about
women in the Bible, Church and Society,
we're including a question a week
during the course of the summer. The
following week when we ask the next
question, we'll give you the name of the
woman described the previous week.
Would you like to be part of this year's
Bible Study? Think about it! We could
design the sessions around those who
participate. For example, if more
convenient, we could meet Sunday
mornings after Mass for 45-60 minutes
a session. We could also divide the
year into several sessions such as Sept-
Nov (break just before Thanksgiving),
mid January until the week before Palm
Sunday, and after Easter until the end
of May.

If you have any questions or would like
to take part in these Bible Study
Sessions, please contact Sr. Eileen.

her son Moses, the great leader of the
Israelites, and probably you recall how
she and her daughter saved his life as
an infant. Can you name this mother
and daughter? (Hint: you can find them
in the Book of Exodus).
