## A Word from Father Jerry

Dear Parishioners,

The month of November has been by tradition designated as a month of remembrance. We recall our beloved dead, we recall the communion of saints, and we recall the reality of our own mortality.

Each year we designate the Shrine in the West transept as our place of remembrance. Please bring pictures of your deceased loved ones to this place of honor. Each liturgy celebrated during the month of November will be for the repose of the souls of our beloved dead.

On Monday, November 1st, there will be a Mass at noon to celebrate the Feast of All Saints. On Tuesday, November 2nd, there will be a Mass at 6:00 p.m. to celebrate The Feast of All Souls. The celebrant will be Fr. Mike Caruso SJ, the new President of St. Ignatius Prep. A reception will follow over at the High School. On November 15th, there will be a Mass at 7:00 p.m. for all families that have experienced the loss of a loved one this past year. On Sunday Nov. 7th there will be special activities at all of the Catholic Cemeteries to honor our beloved dead.

Last week the Steering Committee for the formation of our new Pastoral Council met. Through the leadership and wisdom of Sr. Mary Therese Freymann, we are making a lot of progress. It takes time to talk through the principles and procedures of the Council so it will be effective. Our next meeting will be on Sunday, November 14th.

In the coming weeks, Aid for Women, the St. Vincent de Paul Society, the Knights of Malta and the Chicago Chorale will be having events here. 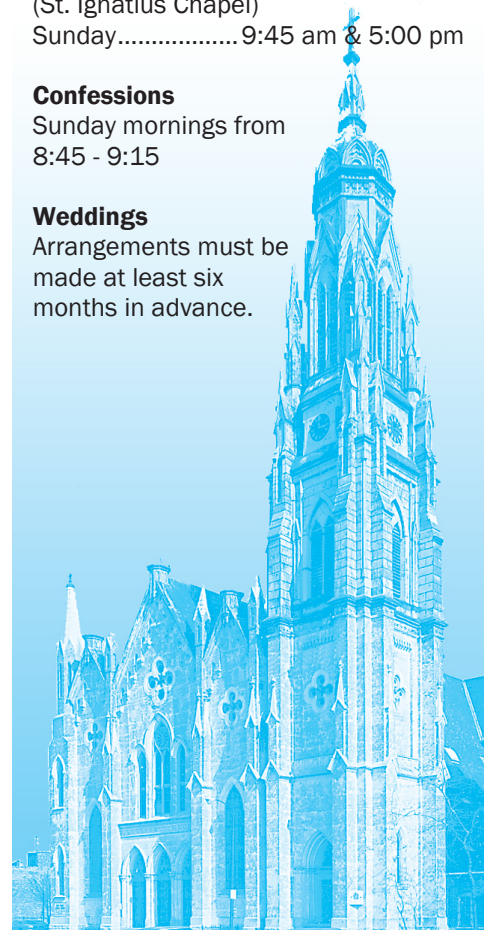

### Reading 1

*Wis 11:22-12:2*

Before the LORD the whole universe is as a grain from a balance or a drop of morning dew come down upon the earth. But you have mercy on all, because you can do all things; and you overlook people's sins that they may repent. For you love all things that are and loathe nothing that you have made; for what you hated, you would not have fashioned. And how could a thing remain, unless you willed it; or be preserved, had it not been called forth by you? But you spare all things, because they are yours, O LORD and lover of souls, for your imperishable spirit is in all things! Therefore you rebuke offenders little by little, warn them and remind them of the sins they are committing, that they may abandon their wickedness and believe in you, O LORD!

*Lk 19:1-10*

Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way. When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." And he came down quickly and received him with joy. When they all saw this, they began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner." But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a descendant of Abraham. For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost."
